Our hospital and clinics provide a remarkable amount of essential care each year. Here's how much.

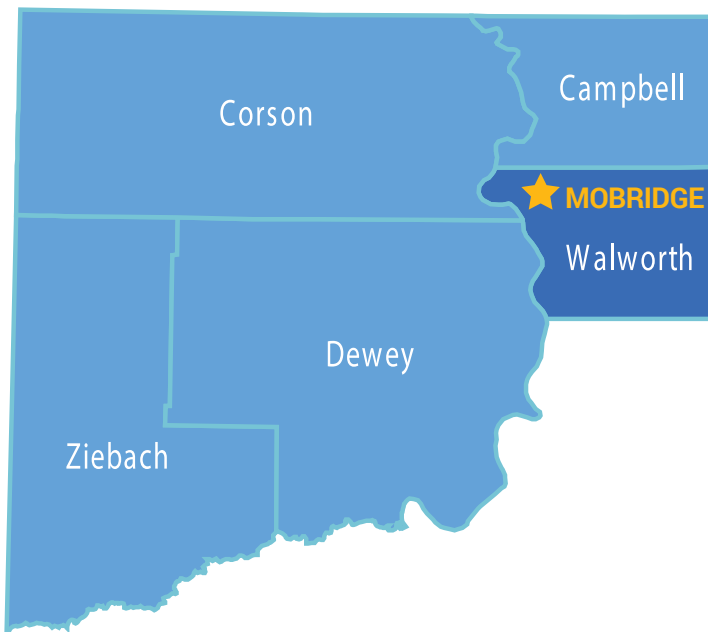
They say a picture is worth a thousand words. Numbers, too, sometimes tell a story more effectively than the written word.

visits.



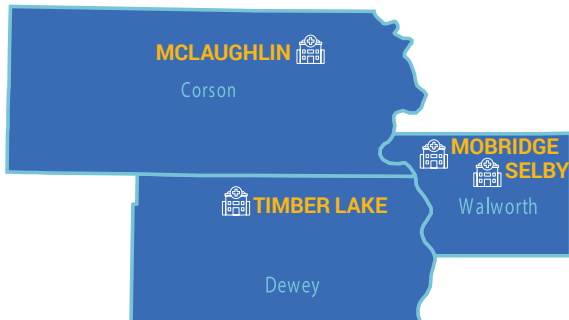
TRAUMAS

The most common surgeries at MRH&C are in Orthopedics (such as joint scopes), ENT (such as ear tubes), Podiatry, Ophthalmology (such as cataracts), and General (such as gallbladder removal and appendectomies).

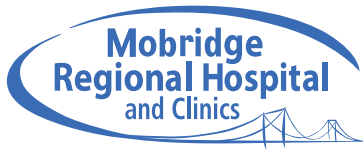
