

Serving Our Community 24/7: MRH&C Ambulance Service

If you or someone you care about is severely injured or has a stroke, heart attack, seizure, or other health emergency, calling 911 is the fastest, safest way to get help.

If you're near Mobridge, a Mobridge Regional Hospital & Clinics Ambulance Service crew will be on their way to you within minutes.

In 2024, MRH&C Ambulance Service responded to 947 calls for service—about three per day on average. Emergencies don't arise predictably, though, so some days are relatively slow while others may involve six or more calls—some up to 60 miles away.

Ambulance Director Stephanie Dame has been with MRH&C for 11 years and has served as director for five years. She oversees a staff of 19 EMTs, paramedics, and ambulance drivers, 10 of whom are full-time.

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Interested in Joining Our Ambulance Crew?

We need more Emergency Medical Services staff who live in or near Mobridge! Fulltime and part-time positions are available. To learn about training to become an EMT, paramedic, or ambulance driver, email MRH&C Ambulance Director Stephanie Dame at stephanie.dame@commonspirit.org. Training classes are held locally, and Mobridge Regional Health Care Foundation covers fees when needed. A Cadet Program is also available for students in grades 9 through 12. Welcome, Dr. Hannun!



We are delighted to announce that Dr. Merhej Hannun has joined the MRH&C Mobridge Medical Clinic family medicine team. Dr. Hannun (pronounced hah-NOON) comes to us by way of a family medicine residency in Reading, Pennsylvania, and before that, clinical rotations in Bedford, England, Chicago, Illinois, and Cyprus as well as medical school at the University of London.

"I've lived and worked in large cities, but I was looking for a quieter, rural life with community ties," Dr. Hannun said. "I come from a small village in Lebanon where people don't lock their doors. I've already purchased a house in Mobridge because I'm certain I can thrive here and be a helpful part of this community."

Dr. Hannun provides care to people of all ages, from infants to older adults as well as pregnant women. He will be delivering babies and has been C-section trained. He lived with his grandparents for many years and is at ease with seniors. He also has a passion for treating addictions.

Dr. Hannun's mother and father (who is an OB-GYN) remain in Lebanon but visit the U.S. regularly. His two siblings live in New York City. In his free time, Dr. Hannun enjoys traveling, studying world history and cultures, and being outdoors. Here in Mobridge, he's looking forward to learning to hunt, fish, and ride horses.

"Our call volumes have increased quite a bit in recent years, and our staffing has decreased, mostly because older EMS crew members are retiring," Dame said. "We've been seeing a steady rise in need. It may be because people have become more active again since the COVID-19 public health emergency ended. It's good to be more active, but it also naturally leads to more illness and injury."

Emergencies, Transfers, Hospital Support, and Events

In addition to responding to emergencies, MRH&C Ambulance Service handles patient transfers by ambulance from one facility to another, averaging 20 transfers a month. Because the team is hospital-based, they also help in the emergency room when they're not responding to calls. In addition, the crew is proud to provide standby emergency care at public events, such as the rodeo, Indian Horse Relays, Demolition Derby, and football games.

"A lot of us enjoy our jobs because we like to be able to help people in our community," Dame said. "Some of the experiences we have stay with us for a lifetime. We bond as a crew and with the community."

An EMS Consortium

MRH&C ambulance crews don't work alone. Emergency Medical Services, or EMS, is a naturally collaborative field. Ambulance Service has good working relationships with other local first responders, such as law enforcement and fire departments. In addition, surrounding services, like Campbell County EMS, Selby Ambulance, Standing Rock EMS, and Timber Lake EMS often work with the Mobridge team to ensure each emergency is handled as effectively as possible.

Each area EMS service is different in its structure and the types of emergencies it's equipped to handle. Among the four surrounding organizations listed above, one is county-owned, one is an independent nonprofit, one is tribally owned, and one is city-owned. Some ambulances are equipped to provide Basic Life Support (BLS) and others Advanced Life Support (ALS).

"MRH&C has ALS crews, four ambulances, and a larger team," Dame said. "We provide back-up to EMS teams in the surrounding areas when they need us."

Haden Merkel, MRH&Cs' Philanthropy Engagement Coordinator, recently worked with regional EMS leaders to secure first a planning grant and then an implementation grant from the South Dakota Department of Health to help coordinate regional EMS collaboration. The funding will pay for additional Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) and free public first aid trainings in five area communities, Handtevy tools (for pediatric patients), EMS and first responder training classes and supplies, the development of a K-12 curriculum for youth interested in exploring EMS-related careers, and a community health worker position to help short-staffed EMS services maximize the grants' impact.

"We're all dealing with the same things and have the same kinds of challenges," Merkel said. "This grant funding will help us better coordinate training and care."

"A Calling of the Heart"

EMS work is "a calling of the heart," said Darcy Dykhouse, MRH&C Executive Assistant. "MRH&C Ambulance Service does a remarkable job, but we need more EMTs and paramedics. We hope more community members will get involved."

"We are blessed to have such skilled and dedicated EMS team members, who jump into action whenever needed," said MRH&C CEO John J. Ayoub. "Thank you to our EMS crews. They save lives every day."
